

Consignment Items for Country Store 2010

Thank you in advance for your consignment items. As new chairpeople of the store, we ask that you review the following information. Then, fill out the Inventory List on the reverse side of this page. Make a copy of the list, leave one with us and keep the other for yourself. Donated items DO NOT need to be listed.

1. We will store your consignment items until the show, but the Guild cannot guarantee the safety of your items. Every effort will be made, however, to keep your items clean and safe.
2. As in the past, those who successfully sell items on consignment will be assessed a 20% fee, which will go to the guild.
3. Items brought for sale must be small enough to set out on our tables. Larger items can be offered, but we ask that you take a photo of them, write out a description, your contact information and specify your suggested price. We plan to have a bulletin board in the store where we will display this information. The sale can then be arranged between you and the customer. The Guild will still expect the 20% consignment fee for these types of sale.
4. Items brought for sale must be tagged using the special Country Store tags which we will supply. This tag should be filled out as follows, and either tied or taped onto your item. This will assure that the proceeds from your item will be distributed to you. Anything not tagged in this way will be sold as a donation to the guild.
5. Fabric should be measured, rolled and bound with a colored paper strip, on which is your consignment # and the yardage. Also, please attach the special "consignment tag" (sample below). This must be attached to the fabric in order for you to get credit for the sale.

At the time of the sale, the tag will be separated at the dotted line. The top portion will remain with the item (for the customer) and the bottom portion will be placed into a slotted coffee can. At the end of the show, the tags can then be sorted by consignee number and the amounts easily computed for each of you. In the past there have been problems with sticky price labels getting lost, torn, etc. We are hoping that this new system will make things easier for the cashiers and tag sorters and will allow the customer to remember what he/she paid for the item....and will assure that you get credit for the sale.
